INTRODUCTION.

In the fall of 1887 I met in Paris Mr. George W. Balch of this city, who, wishing to contribute something to the success of the Detroit Museum of Art, then lately founded, requested me to aid him in selecting a collection Braun's Autotypes, illustrating the various ancient schools of painting, for presentation to the museum.

The result was the collection of which this is the catalogue. It numbers in all 430 pieces, and represents the master pieces or important examples of the work of 224 of the most eminent painters of the middle ages.

The Autotype reproductions of works of art, the invention of Adolph Braun, a scientific photographer of Dornach in Alsatia, have attained a world-wide celebrity, as possessing at once all the accuracy of photographs with the entire durability of engravings, and in no other way have the great works of the best ages of art been more exactly reproduced for purposes of art study.

In arranging this catalogue the system has been adopted of classifying the works under the few great national schools, and then, disregarding minor subdivisions of these schools, placing the artists as nearly as possible in chronological order. The Italian schools are the first given, followed in order by the Spanish, German, Flemish, Dutch, French and English. This is very nearly the classification adopted by Karl Woermann, director of the Dresden Gallery, in the admirable catalogue of that magnificent collection.

In the determination of the correct names and most approved orthography of the artists mentioned, reference has been had to the new edition of Bryan's Dictionary of Painters and Engravers, the standard authority in the English language; but as many of these names would be unfamiliar to the reader the name under which the artist is more popularly known is frequently also given in brackets.

Following the name will be found the dates of birth and death of the artist, with the subordinate school to which he is generally reckoned as belonging. Following the titles of the pictures, the gallery to which the original of each belongs is given.

Surprise may be felt that so few Italian galleries are represented. The explanation is this: The Messrs. Braun have within the past few years so materially improved their process that they have abandoned all their old plates, and are re-photographing in succession, as fast as it can be done, the chief galleries of Europe. Up to the time of the formation of this collection none of the Italian galleries had been reached with the new process, and consequently examples of the various masters had to be selected from the leading galleries of Northern Europe and Spain. Happily these galleries contain a liberal share of the masterpieces, even

of the Italian painters, while for the other schools the Italian galleries are not at all noted. No doubt later on some other liberal minded citizen will supplement this collection of Autotypes with a representation of the more famous Italian collections.

It would have been a pleasure to have amplified the present catalogue by telling something of the lives of the several painters; explaining the stories told in their compositions, and quoting the remarks upon them of the various distinguished critics and writers; but this would have made the catalogue too voluminous and costly. The reader, however, will find it a pleasant and profitable task himself to supply by research this information.

The space available in the museum building prohibits the exhibition of the entire collection at one time; it will therefore be exhibited in two or more successive sections.
