ABSTRACT:	<p>Peggy Hoyt grew up in Saginaw, Michigan, but moved to New York City as a child. Becoming interested in fashion while away at school, Hoyt became an apprentice at a Fifth Avenue millinery shop after graduation. By 1915, she established her own clothing shop, Peggy Hoyt, Inc., and a few years later, married a naval officer named Aubrey Eads. After World War I, Hoyt broadened her fashion reach by designing women's clothing, as well as theatre costumes, hats, and perfumes.</p> <p>This collection contains a Peggy Hoyt check with a signature; 2 pieces of correspondence between Aubrey Eads and Frank Cruise, her accountant and business manager; 3 photographic prints of the Peggy Hoyt Salon in New York City; an autographed photographic print of Aubrey Eads; and a booklet from the American Newspaper Publishers Association convention entitled "The Right Angle."</p>
