ABSTRACT:	<p>Edward D. Sculley, born in 1813 in Mayfield, Michigan, worked on his family farm until 1861. He then moved to Lapeer, Michigan, to learn the blacksmithing trade. By 1872, he was working in the field, and set up the firm of Sculley &amp; Merson in 1881.</p> <p>The E.D. Sculley Collection contains assorted blacksmith's ledgers and account books, receipts, a statue of Jesus, a snuff tin, and a leather case containing a pair of eyeglasses. Also included are Edison Institute invoices from 1959-1960 for blacksmithing supplies and equipment signed by E.Hartman/Blacksmith. This may be Earl Hartman, who worked for the museum at the time.</p>
