ABSTRACT:	<p>The Macintosh 512k personal computer was marketed in 1985, and had an increased memory capacity over the previous Macintosh design, the 128k. When purchased, the computer came with an assortment of program disks and manuals, with more being able to be purchased by the consumer.</p> <p>The Macintosh 512k Personal Computer Materials contain items collected by the original purchaser of the computer. These contain the original purchase receipt and repair paperwork; a sample of printer paper; the original Macintosh operating manuals in their case, as well as 9 other books and manuals; one box containing nine 3.5" floppy disks; MasterType and Colormate operating software; and 3 computer games in packages, "Exodus Ultima III," "Murder By the Dozen," and "Mouse Stampede."</p>
